Program Overview:

DigiPix explores the world of digital photography and how using a digital camera can allow you to experiment with different techniques. The program will begin with a discussion of digital cameras and accessories for the beginner and more experienced photographer. The program will then cover how to use light and different weather conditions to their best advantage. Finally, we will discuss simple concepts of composition that will make your pictures more than simply “snapshots.” At the end of the program we will look at a number of photographs and let the audience discuss what they do – or do not – like about each. This program is suitable for young adults and older individuals, and may be helpful for those seeking to buy their first digital camera or are considering upgrading from an older one.

Program Length:

1.5 – 2 hours, depending on audience participation.

Presenter Requirements:

A location with sufficient seating for a maximum (recommended) of 50 attendees, and a digital projector and screen. A PA system may be used if acoustics make it advisable. A master for handouts will be provided prior to presentation for the library to copy as it chooses.

Program Cost:

A set fee of \$150.00 is charged for this program.

The Presenter:

William Ruting has been an avid amateur photographer for over 35 years, starting with 35mm and turning to digital in 2001. Bill has also worked professionally as a wedding and event photographer, and was a fire investigation photographer for 10 years. A member of the Salt Creek Camera Club he has won awards for his entries in the “small print” competitions.
